Collin Wright, a livestock farmer, business owner and resident of Ramble District, Hanover died on August 26, 2021 at the age of 79 years. Collin is survived by his children Colin, Ian, Natalie, Dwight and Dwayne; grandchildren, nieces, nephews and several other relatives and dear friends. He is predeceased by his late wife Lorna Wright and son Bryan Wright.

Affectionately known as "Busha", referencing his lifelong career as a livestock farmer, or plainly Mr. Wright; Collin grew up in the parish of St. Elizabeth where, at a very young age and following in his father's footsteps, he developed a liking for livestock and an affinity for entrepreneurship. These passions so early in life led him to becoming a manager of multiple livestock farms throughout Jamaica in the 1960s and 1970s and eventually owning and operating a livestock farm and other businesses in Ramble District where he resided. During that time his influence on the Jamaican livestock agricultural landscape became evident. He was an active member of the Jamaica Livestock Association, Beef and Dairy Cattle Producers Association, Jamaica Dairy Farmers Association, and the Rural Agricultural Development Authority (RADA).

An active member of the Savanna Lamar Baptist Church, Mr. Wright is remembered throughout Western Jamaica as truly selfless, giving, kind, and supportive. He served as a resource to so many in his community, happily

serving as a Justice of the Peace (JP), a former chairman of the Knockalva Agricultural School Board and a "grass roots" community leader that was deeply connected with the people.

He was a devoted father, and a loving husband, who enjoyed every moment in the company of his children and grandchildren. A true legend in his own right, Collin Wright leaves behind a legacy that serves as a model for anyone seeking to live an upstanding and morally-driven life. He will be deeply missed by his family, friends, and all who knew him.
